Courses Individually Developed:

Nursing 1000: introduction to Nursing, Health, & Language of Healthcare

This course introduces students to personal health, the language of healthcare, and the role of the professional nurse. Students study health from the perspective of the individual, discuss factors that promote and maintain healthy lifestyles, and apply them in the development of a behavioral change project to promote their own health.

Nursing 3301: Application of Nursing Care Concepts to Clients with Episodic Health Challenges

This course provides students the opportunity to expand their use of the nursing process in the care of patients and families experiencing episodic health care challenges. Students apply nursing concepts in providing care to patients and childbearing families.

Nursing 6310: Nurse Leader and Manager: Managing Health Care Delivery

This course will focus the professional nurse on the concepts of leader and manager. The student will apply knowledge and theoretical frameworks within systems to foster mentoring, empowerment, and influence of staff and collaboration in patient care delivery.
